

## **PERSONAL WATER CRAFT**

Personal Water Craft, commonly known as jet-skis are not permitted to launch from the central slipway at Dymchurch.

Personal Water Craft are permitted to launch at High Knocke Slipway, accessible via the Martello Tower no.25 Car Park, the entrance is opposite Tesco Express and on the same side as the Ocean Public House.

Personal watercraft users please read the following notice:

### **DYMCHURCH CENTRAL SLIPWAY**

Dymchurch central beach is very popular during the summer season and many demands are made on the beach and sea by different user groups.

**The second slipway at High Knocke, Dymchurch is now open – Jet-Ski users are requested to use the second slipway and not the central slipway.**

It is in everyone's interest and safety that these guidelines are respected:

- The central slipway is for the public to launch and recover boats and is also a route for persons on foot using the beach.
- The central slipway must be kept free of obstruction at all times.
- No parking of vehicles, trailers or Jet-skis allowed on the central slipway or beach.
- Only one vehicle can use the central slipway at any one time.
- Personal Watercraft users, are requested to use the slipway at High Knocke.

- **Personal Watercraft Trailers** can be left on the rough ground at the top of the Martello Tower car park, close to the High Knocke Slipway
- **Personal watercraft users** should use High Knocke slipway. **IN NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE THEY ALLOWED TO ENTER THE AREA OF WATER WITHIN THE LINE OF BUOYS** by central beach.
- **The Jet-ski Byelaws** will be enforced and users are reminded that the speed of their craft should not exceed 8 knots.
- **Personal Water craft** can be re-fuelled on the beach by High Knocke Slipway, but **NO FUEL IS TO BE KEPT ON THE BEACH EITHER IN CANS OR IN JET-SKIS** once re-fuelling has taken place.
